Deb's early life was filled with hardship. After growing up in a home filled with physical and verbal abuse, she had high hopes for a better life when she met her husband.





shame that is associated with addiction. We want to be the forerunner in removing the stigma! Those in recovery should be celebrated just like cancer survivors.

Using pro-recovery language is a start. Safe Harbor wants to remove labels attached to substance use disorder. A Christian has a new identity in Christ! The past does not define them!
